TE WHANAU A APANUI DEMENTIA CARE & EDUCATION DAY, TE KAHA



The Alzheimers EBOP team with their Kaumatua/Cultural Advisor Abe Rangi held a one day education forum on 15th May in Te Kaha. This was the result of many months of travel, support and education to families, caregivers and others by the Alzheimers Eastern Bay of Plenty team, with funding from Disability Community Trust. Local and other stakeholders/key people involved were the local GP, staff from a rest home and Iwi Health & Social Services people. Legal advice on Enduring Power of Attorney was given as well as professional support for individuals and families whose lives are affected by dementia.

This was well attended with locals from the community and even as far away as Lotin Point. Some of the comments received:

- I would like to become a carer, very informative & knowledgeable
- I am a community support worker and support a person living with dementia. Interested in learning more.

The main question asked was "What is the difference between Alzheimer and Dementia?"
