



**Leave a Lasting Legacy to
the future of Alzheimers NZ**





Our Work

At a national level our work and services include raising awareness of dementia, providing information and resources, advocating for high quality services and promoting research about prevention, treatment, cure and care. We also support and work with local Alzheimers NZ organisations throughout New Zealand, each of which is a member of Alzheimers NZ, to provide support, education, information and related services directly to members of their communities who are affected by dementia.

Alzheimers NZ relies on donations, grants and legacies to continue this work. Legacies are one of the most significant forms of funding we receive and having the ability to commit those funds each year allows us to plan and fund long-term and innovative programmes. You can be assured that any legacy left to Alzheimers NZ, whether large or small, is put to good use.





How to Start

Anyone, of any financial situation, can leave a gift in their will to Alzheimers NZ and every cent helps in our work towards a dementia friendly New Zealand.

Making a list of all your assets and liabilities or speaking with a financial planner will help you assess your financial position. This will also help your lawyer identify any particular issues that might be important for you. Writing or amending your will is a relatively simple process, but we always recommend you seek advice from your lawyer.

When updating your will it's important to include the full legal name of the charity and their registered charity number. Our legal name is Alzheimers New Zealand incorporated and our registered charity number is CC21026.

The different types of legacies are listed below along with examples of suggested wording for each:

1. A CASH BEQUEST

A cash or pecuniary bequest is the gift of a specific or set sum of money to a particular person, public body or charity etc. This may be a specific amount or percentage or fraction of your estate. The person or charity you have named as recipient of your gift will receive precisely the sum of money you have specified.

Wording Example: *"I give and bequeath free of all duties to Alzheimers New Zealand Incorporated, (registered charity number CC21026), the sum of \$_____ to be applied by Alzheimers New Zealand incorporated for its general charitable purposes, and I declare that the receipt of Alzheimers New Zealand Incorporated shall be on full and sufficient discharge to my Trustee(s) for such a bequest."*



2. A SPECIFIC BEQUEST

If you wish to make a bequest of specific items from your estate, such as a house, car, furniture, art etc to people, public bodies or charities, you can do so through a specific bequest. It is important that you clearly identify the item or assets in your will so give as much information as you can.

Wording example: *“I give and bequeath free of all duties to Alzheimers New Zealand Incorporated, (registered charity number CC21026), [the specific item you wish to leave] to be applied by Alzheimers New Zealand incorporated for its general charitable purposes and I declare that the receipt of Alzheimers New Zealand Incorporated shall be full and sufficient discharge to my Trustee(s) for such a bequest.”*





3. A RESIDUAL BEQUEST

The residue of your estate is what is left over when loved ones have been looked after, all cash legacies and other gifts have been made and the debts and expenses of administering the estate have been deducted. You can leave the residue of your estate in its entirety or just the share you specify to people, public bodies or charities.

Wording example: *“I give and bequeath free of all duties [write either ‘all’ or specify the part you wish to leave] the residue of my estate to be applied by Alzheimers New Zealand Incorporated, (registered charity number CC21026), for its general charitable purposes and I declare that the receipt of Alzheimers New Zealand Incorporated shall be full and sufficient discharge to my trustee(s) for such a bequest.”*



SUPPORTER CHARTER
