# Dementia Prevention Research Clinics

Recruit a large *cohort* of individuals from Aotearoa New Zealand with:

- ❖ *mild cognitive impairment (MCI)*
- ❖ *the earliest stage of Alzheimer's disease*
- ❖ *healthy older adults*

to be involved in longitudinal study (10 years)

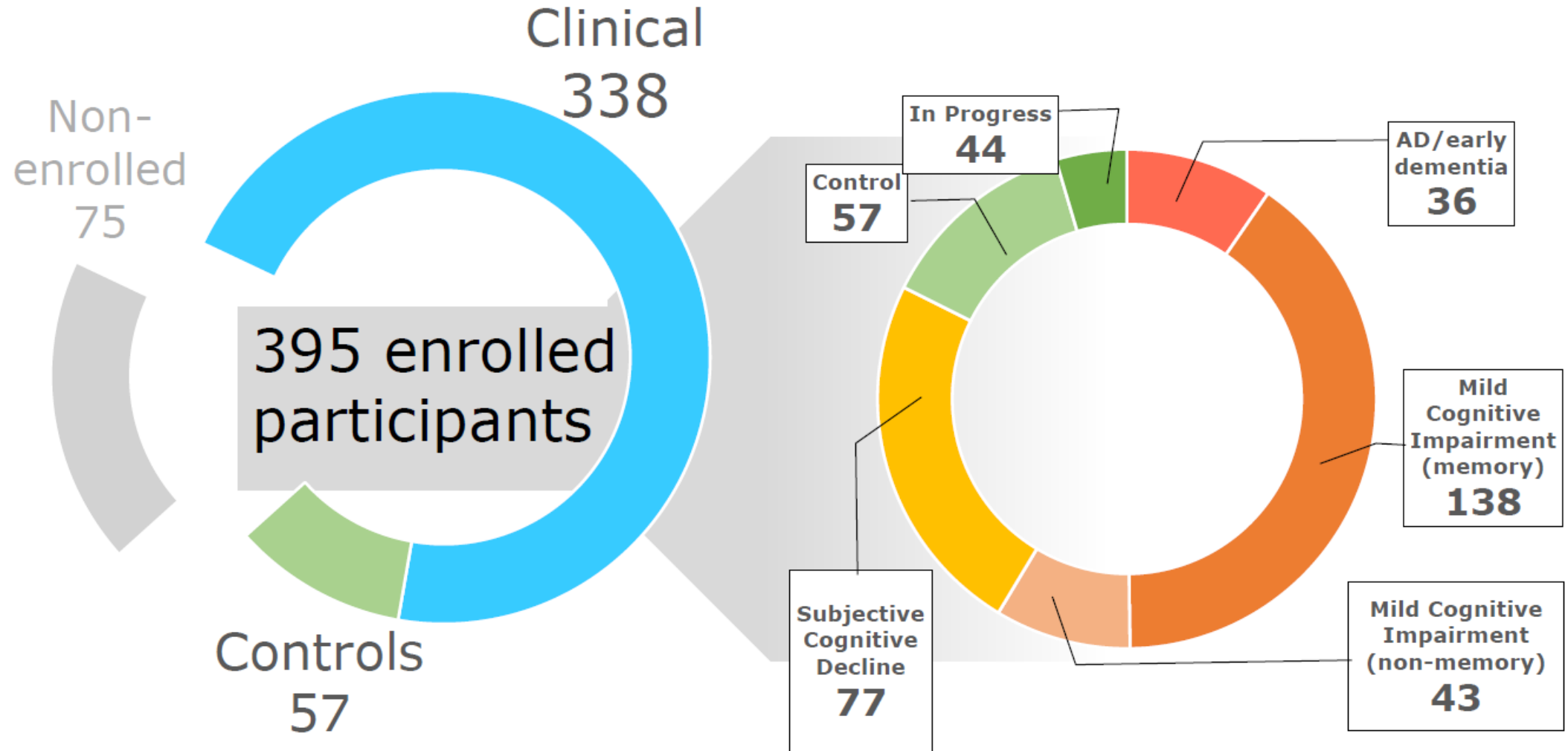




# Dementia Prevention Research Clinic: Aims

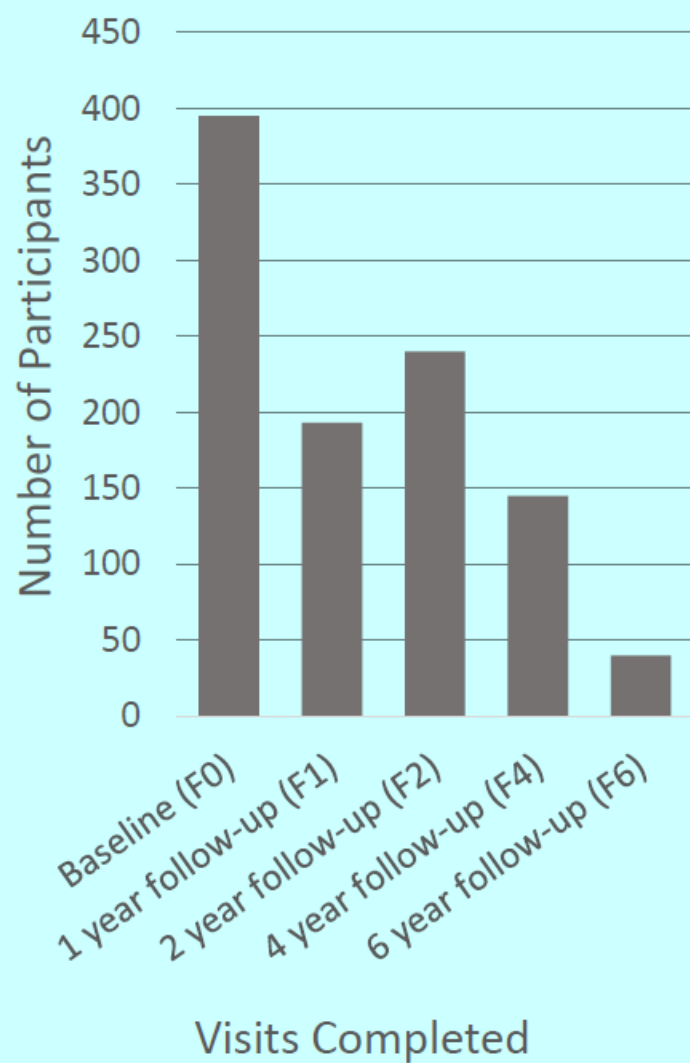
1. To identify a **‘biomarker signature’**, or **pattern**, that predicts progression from MCI to AD, and that affects rate of progression in a NZ cohort
2. To understand the experiences of individuals and their whānau living with mild cognitive impairment and dementia
3. To investigate and identify mechanisms underlying the development of these conditions

**470 participants assessed**

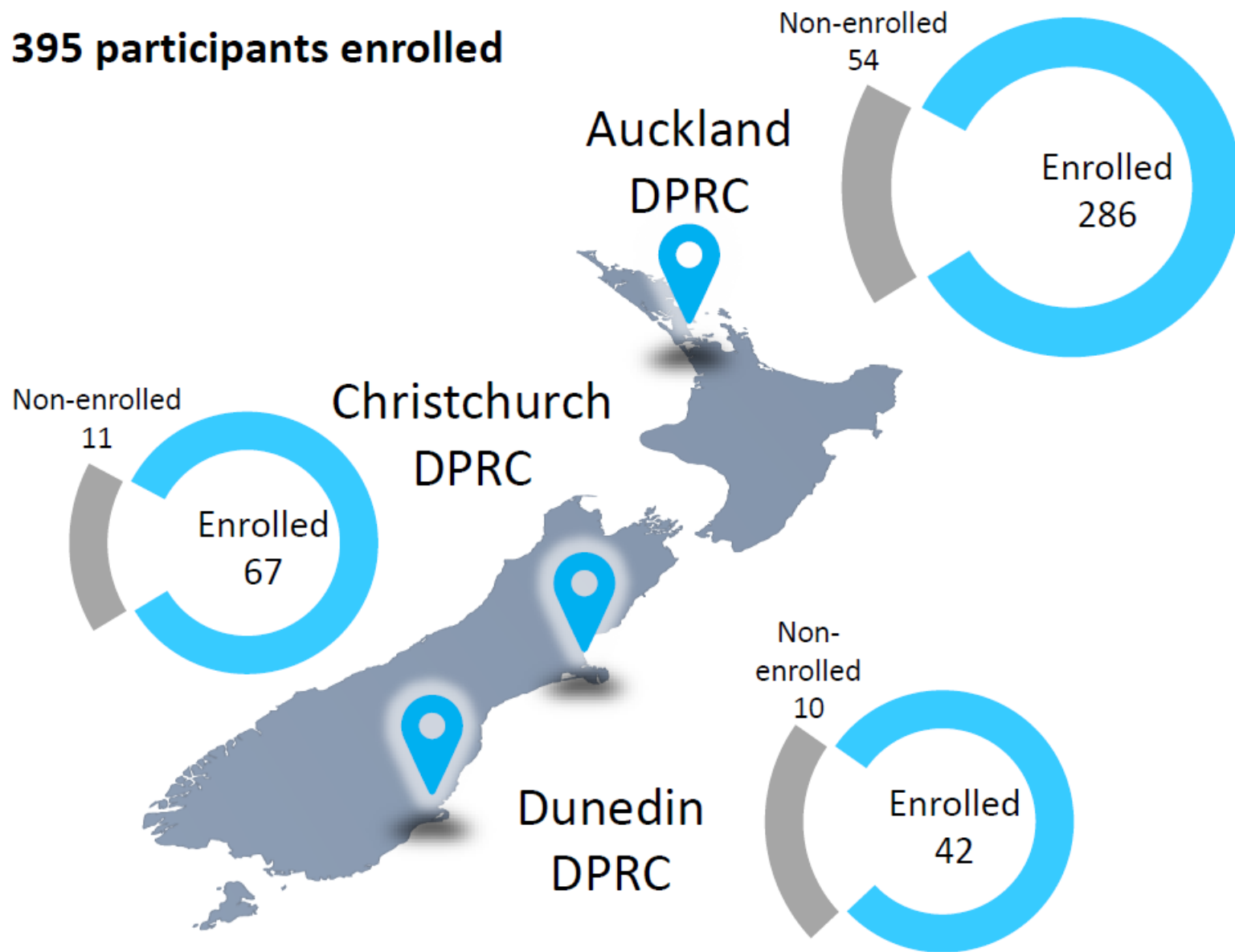




## Enrolled Participants

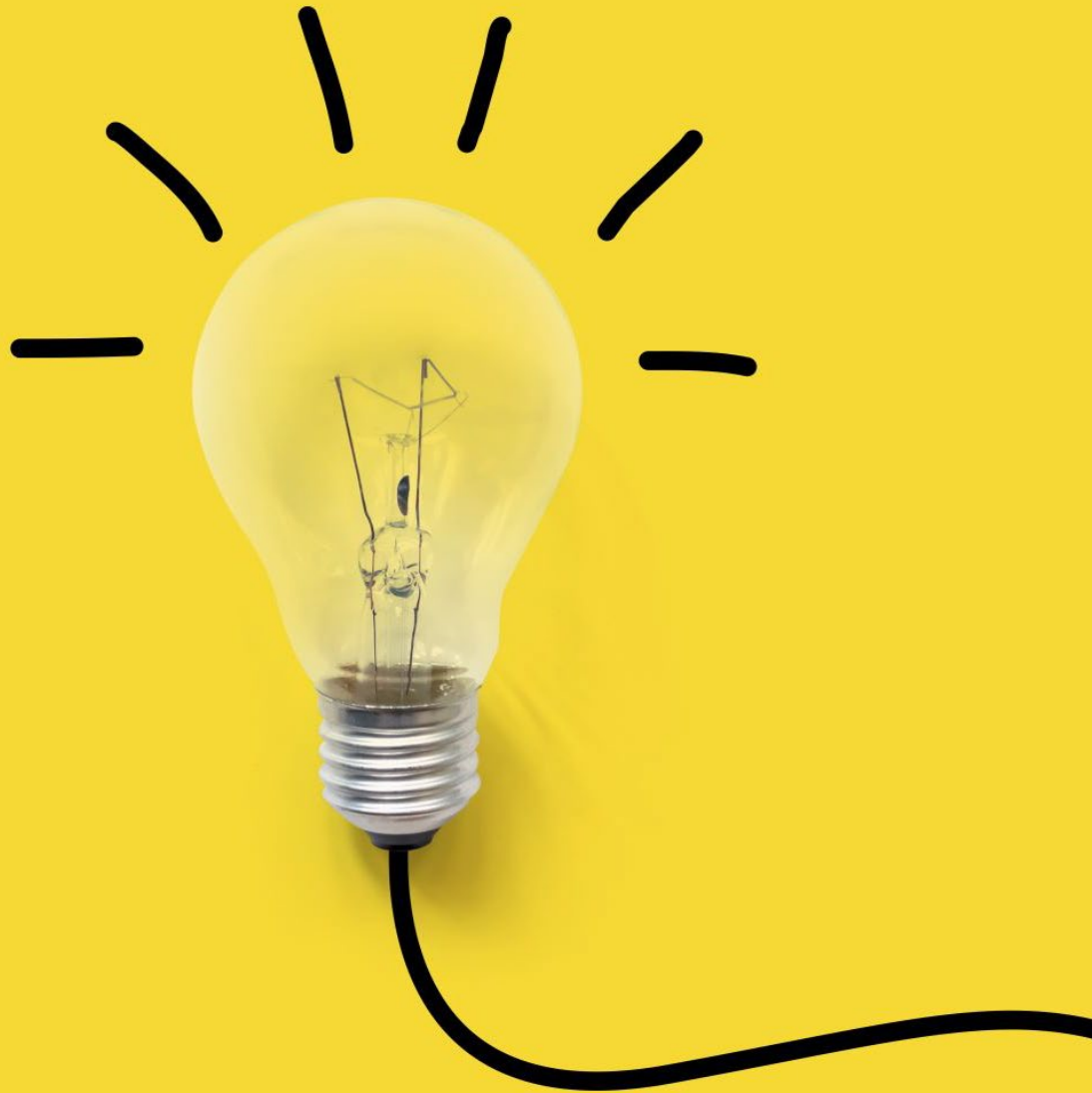


**395 participants enrolled**

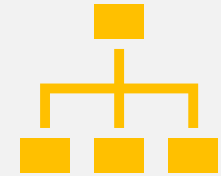

Review current practices in Auckland, Christchurch and Dunedin DPRC clinics



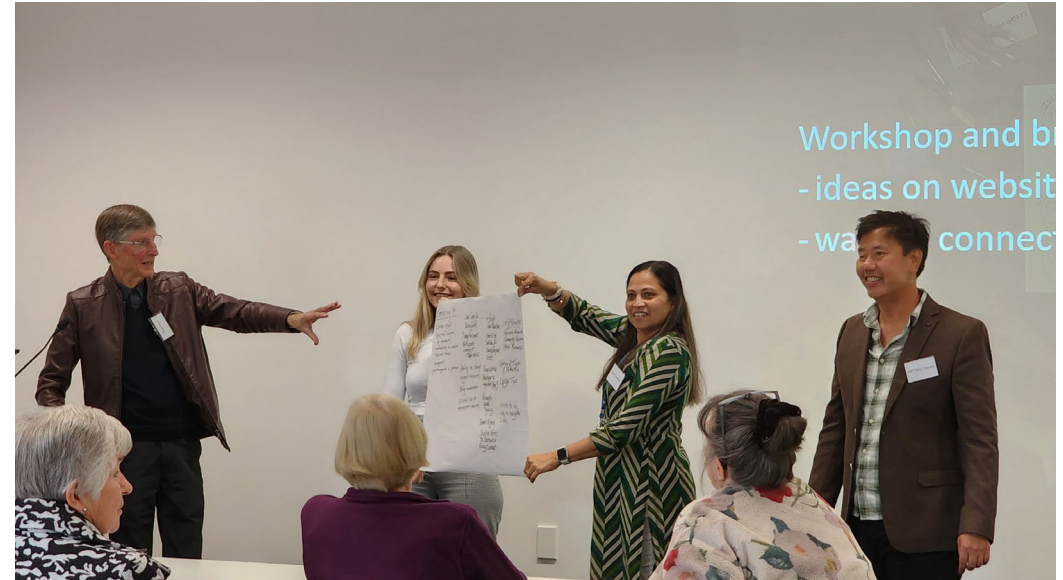


## Activity 3. Māori participants focus group
