Recruit a large *cohort* of individuals from Aotearoa New Zealand with:

- mild cognitive impairment (MCI)
- the earliest stage of Alzheimer's disease
- healthy older adults

to be involved in longitudinal study (10 years)












Dementia Prevention Research Clinic: Aims

- 1. To identify a 'biomarker signature', or pattern, that predicts progression from MCI to AD, and that affects rate of progression in a NZ cohort
- 2. To understand the experiences of individuals and their whānau living with mild cognitive impairment and dementia
- 3. To investigate and identify mechanisms underlying the development of these conditions

470 participants assessed








Benefits of involving participants in dementia prevention research


Activity 3. Māori participants focus group
