



Whānau Interviews

- Identify examples of cognitive difficulties
- Look for novel constructs
- Look for different prominence of a domain
 - "if I have some of my nieces or nephews pop in and see her, it'll take a little bit to recognise who they are, and then there's her putting their relationship with the parents, you know, or she might say "Oh your so and so's daughter aye," and it's not."
 - Can knowledge of whakapapa be built into tool?
 - long-stored knowledge of a particular type that is important



Domains assessed

ORIENTATION	Time, place, personal
LANGUAGE	Repetition, Verbal Comprehension, Picture Naming
MEMORY	Anterograde, Working Memory, Delayed Recall
EXECUTIVE FUNCTIONING	Abstract Thought, Category Fluency, Luria Test (execution of a learned motor programme, inhibitory control, attentional flexibility, working memory, and motor planning.
VISUOSPATIAL FUNCTIONING	Copying a Figure

10. Picture Naming

I am going to show you some pictures. I want you to tell me what they are.



I want you to spell the word 'kai" (food)

If the person cannot spell 'kai', do not proceed with the task. Administer Digits Backwards instead (12B.)

If the person spells 'kai' correctly, then say:

If I asked you to spell the word 'kai' backwards, you would say "i, a, (k)" Pause to give them the chance to say the last letter "k".

If they understand, proceed with the task. If not, repeat the practice trial. If they still do not understand do not proceed with the task. Administer Digits Backwards instead.

Now please spell the word "hongi" (hor-ngee; traditional greeting) backwards

12B. DIGITS BACKWARD

I am going to say some numbers to you. When I stop, I want you to say those numbers to me, backwards. For example, if I say 8 - 2 what will you say?

Correct response (2-8) Say, *That's right*.

Incorrect response: Say, That's not quite right. I said 8 -2 so to say them backwards you should say 2 -8.






ROC Curve for Model

Area Under the Curve = 0.8086




Specificity = 76%





ROC Curve for Model


Area Under the Curve = 0.8423




Cut-point = 36


Sensitivity = 73%


